Together, we're able to create a variety of helpful resources, activities, and programs. All these are created with a single purpose – to create a brighter, safer future for our children.

Results lower the risk of children and young people falling victim to trafficking and other types of exploitation. It's not only about survival, but also about delivering healthier and more prosperous opportunities for them. Outcomes open up improved livelihood opportunities, boost education and awareness, strengthen women, and champion kid's rights.

Where We Work

One Thousand Villages works in Thailand, Myanmar, Cambodia, and Lao PDR. We have our offices in the beautiful cities of Pattaya in Thailand and Melbourne in Australia.

How We Work

Our objective is to combat the sexual exploitation and trafficking of children in the Mekong region.

We recognize that poverty and exploitation are interconnected, and thus our approach seeks to identify and remove the underlying causes of poverty and exploitation. To this end, we collaborate with local schools, community leaders, and other organisations to create meaningful opportunities and resources for those who are at risk. We also work to educate the public on the dangers of sexual exploitation and trafficking of children, and to provide parents and guardians with the resources and information they need to protect their children.

Our goal is to see a future where children are free from the horrors of sexual exploitation and trafficking in the Mekong Region.

Programs

Our partnerships with village schools, families, and local leaders continue to grow. Investing in these is a very big priority for us and we are very thankful for our leaders in every community and their work not only aiding the poor but also confronting and challenging the structures and institutions that enable it to continue.

Everywhere we work puts us face to face with issues that underpin why children are trafficked and lured to marriages and commercial sexual exploitation. By working with local leaders, village schools, and families, we are able to create a safe and secure environment for children and young people to grow and develop. Our commitment and resources to our partnerships are helping to reduce vulnerability and create a brighter future for generations to come. We are immensely proud of the work we are able to do and the impact we have had on the lives of so many.

Program Highlights

Over the past year, we have put in a great deal of effort to develop new workshops for young people to teach them skills that will help them find employment and become active members of their communities.

A significant number of the girls in our programs do not have meaningful relationships with both their parents. We frequently hear from local village leaders and schools who seek our support for youth that are susceptible to trafficking and exploitation. The harsh realities of poverty in their homes is an uphill battle for them. Many girls go through periods of anxiety, and they need support to improve their self-esteem and learn how to handle tough situations. Our team collaborates closely with their families, teachers, and other people in their lives.

We have provided much-needed repairs and construction to homes, allowing families to live in safe and secure dwellings. We have improved sanitation in schools and villages, helping to reduce the spread of contagious diseases and improve the quality of life for those living in these areas.

We have distributed emergency relief to those in need, providing them with food, clothing, and other essential items. Despite our best efforts, there is still so much work that needs to be done.

It can be easy to become disheartened when faced with such complex and multifaceted issues, especially those that require a long-term commitment to solve. We need people who share our values and passion to create meaningful and lasting change, and who understand the importance of what we are doing. Without the appropriate resources, our efforts can be in vain.

Funding is essential to reach our goals and much more needs to be done to secure the necessary funds. We must first raise awareness of our mission and its importance, then actively seek out and secure financial contributions from individuals, corporations, and other sources.

We are working really hard to ensure people have basic necessities like food, mosquito nets, and clothing. We will continue doing this all year round and however long it's needed.

It's heartbreaking to see the level of destruction the war has caused. Our goal is to gather maximum support - not only financially, but also by increasing awareness about the events unfolding in Myanmar. By doing this, we can ensure that those who are in greatest need receive the help they need.

Absolutely, we may be a small team with limited resources, but don't let that fool you. We are very aware of the impact we are making. Our work goes far beyond what's visible and without a doubt, we understand just how vital it is.
